## What is a Public Works Institute?

- A Public Works Institute is required to provide a minimum of 90 contact hours of training in 11 core areas.

- Training will be provided by Public Works Practitioners.
- Instructor requirements – minimum of 12 years of public works experience, public works leadership experience, and have earned a college degree or combination of equivalent education and experience.
- The Steering Committee has established an application and review protocol to ensure quality instruction.

- The ideal audience is “current first-line supervisors and up” and “those aspiring to become leaders within the profession.”
- Individuals seeking Certification through the Donald C. Stone, as Public Works Manager, Public Works Executive and Public Works Leadership Fellow
